HAVE YOU CHECKED OUT WHAT'S BEEN ADDED TO THE COMMUNITY RADIO NETWORK?

1200 DEGREES (1 x 55'50)

DJ D, Australia's Premier Turntablist, creates a mix on the 1200s (turntables) using a DVS (digital vinyl system), 12" or 7" vinyl, with original samples of tracks played taking us on a journey through the decades, from the 1950s to now. (2RDJ)

1200 TWELVES (1 x 55'50)

A project of 1200 Degrees and DJ D, 1200 Twelves is a DJ mix spun by one of 100 DJs from around the globe who were tasked with creating a mix from 12 of their 12" vinyl records, all adding up to 1200 twelves. Each episode will feature 1-2 DJs mixing live with minimal talk breaks in between. (2RDJ)

BUBBLE POP (1 x 27'50)

So, what actually goes on in Parliament House? Two journalists new to the Canberra press gallery chat about the week in politics, breaking down what happens in the nation's Parliament for people who don't live inside 'the Canberra bubble'. (CBAA / National Radio News)

MUSIC, MOTHERS & OTHERS (27'50)

Somewhere in the music industry, between 'sex drugs and rock and roll' and The Wiggles, is the rest of us. 'Music Mothers and Others' is an audio parents group — a chance to discuss how parenting fits (or doesn't) into music industry life. (2SER)

SPACE NUTS (27'50)

All things space - news, travels, discoveries, the mysteries and more... with world renown and respected astronomer, Dr. Fred Watson, with broadcast journalist, Andrew Dunkley. They are your space nuts, and have been talking all things space with each other for over 25 years - this program is their latest sojourn in the world of space.

NIMA CHART COUNTDOWN (55'50)

Join Matty J as he counts down the top 10 most played songs by first nations artists on Aussie radio each week. Thanks to the National Indigenous Music Awards for providing the chart each week.

NOT THINKING STRAIGHT (1 x 55'50)

Not Thinking Straight is a broadcast for everyone and is a celebration of the LGBTQ+ community featuring chats with LGBTQI artists, performers, activists and legends and stories about what's happening across the rainbow spectrum. (Bay FM)

BABY BOOMERS GUIDE (1 x 55'50)

'The Baby Boomers' Guide to Life in the 21st Century' is a multimedia healthy ageing project especially for Australians aged 55 and over. Now in its second season, hosts Lex Marinos and Patricia 'Little Pattie' Amphlett discuss issues affecting our ageing population, look back through time to legends of the past, and show you how to get your 2 cents worth as you get older.
